Ontario's first accredited, professional, conservation-based Master's Program

Graduates from the Faculty of Forestry's Master of Forest Conservation (MFC) are making a difference! To date, more than 250 individuals from a variety of academic backgrounds have completed their MFC program and are now working in a broad spectrum of careers, including all levels of government, the ENGO sector, industry, consulting, and their own businesses. Recent accreditation of the program by the Canadian Forestry Accreditation Board is an exciting development that widens the job market for MFC students even further to include job opportunities that require Registered Professional Foresters.

If you have a four year undergraduate degree with at least a mid-B in your final two years, and you want to contribute to conservation of the world's forests, the Master of Forest Conservation may be right for you. With a strong focus on sustainability, conservation, and management, the MFC program includes a guaranteed practical internship, local and international field trips, lectures from leading scientists and practitioners, and individual and group research. Full-time, extended full-time, and part-time options are available

Flexibility exists for students to focus the program to meet their specific career expectations. Areas which can be explored include conservation biology, fire ecology, human dimensions of conservation, urban forest conservation, forest health and protection, silviculture, tropical forest conservation, biomaterial and bio-energy development, and environmental conservation.
