Symposium Topics

Session 1: Canada and the Korean War

We invite any papers that deal with Canada and the Korean War. Examples of specific topics include, but are not limited to: Canada's role and participation in the Korean War, Canada's policies regarding the War, Korea's policies regarding Canada directly or as part of the UN force, or other aspects that highlight the links between the governments and people of Korea and Canada that emerged as a result of the War. This year's special focus will be on the implications of the War for Canada-Korean relations, though we will also accept other papers on the more general theme outlined above.

Session 2: The impact of Korean reunification on regional security

We invite any papers that deal with the issues that may arise from the process of reunification on the Korean Peninsula. Examples of specific topics include, but are not limited to: an examination of the policies of different governments or non-state actors that may impede or encourage reunification, scenarios of reunification, implications of reunification for specific states or groups of states (Korea, Canada, or others), or other important aspects of what Korean reunification might look like or what its implications might be. This year's special focus will be on the role of Canada in the reunification process, though we will also accept other papers on the more general theme outlined above.

- Write a research paper (submit 1-3 page proposal and the selected applicants will be asked to submit 20 pages long research paper) on the topic of your choice.

The deadline for submissions of 1-3 page proposals is **Oct 4, 2016**; successful presenters will be contacted in due course to submit research papers of 20 pages in length by **October 28 2016**.

Rewards

- Opportunities for students to publicize their ideas at the Symposium and online.
- A \$500 scholarship-prize will be awarded for the top essay.
- One or two presenters will have the opportunity to participate in the 2016 Youth Peace Camp in the Republic of Korea.
